**Where are you located?**

I am located north of Nashville, Tennessee, but I will travel!

**How do we book you?**

First, e-mail or call me. My contact information is located on my website, [www.bethanyannphotography.com](http://www.bethanyannphotography.com) and on my photo journal, [www.bethanyannblog.com](http://www.bethanyannblog.com). If I'm available for your wedding day, we can meet up to talk more about your wedding plans. If not, I can refer you to some of my photographer friends.

## Can you pencil us in or hold our date?

The only way for me to hold a date is by a signed contract and a 25% non-refundable retainer of the total purchase.

## What is included in your wedding coverage?

The most basic coverage begins at 6 hours. However, my most popular collection includes 2 photographers, 8 hours, an engagement session & the disc of images with printing permission.

## How many photos do we receive?

A minimum of 600 wedding day images is guaranteed. My second photographer and I take a lot of photos during your day to make sure we capture the best of your day. The outtakes are never delivered because they are 1) redundant, 2) unflattering, or 3) blurry (Yes, I sometimes take blurry photos too), and believe me, you won't miss those!

For an engagement session, a minimum of 80 photos is guaranteed.

## Do we really need a second photographer at our wedding?

Yes, I require a second shooter for all of my weddings – no exceptions. A second photographer, also known as a “second shooter,” provides **so much** on a wedding day. Whether it is capturing a candid moment I wasn't available to capture, photographing the reception area while I'm taking portraits, or documenting your ceremony from a different angle, a second photographer is absolutely necessary, especially during a once-in-a-life-time event.



## When will we receive our photos?

For an engagement session, 3-4 weeks after the session.

For a wedding, 4-7 weeks after the wedding.



## Will we receive the copyrights to the photos?

People often confuse this with printing permission. The copyrights to the photos remain mine, forever. You will receive permission to reproduce the images in order to make prints, albums, and even t-shirts, if you please! The printing permission is for personal use only. You cannot use the images for commercial use. In addition, you cannot change or manipulate the images in any other way than black & white or sepia tone changes.

## If you give us the files, why should we buy prints from you?

It's convenient; all the photos are on the online gallery! You can instantly share the link with friends and family so they can order prints, too. Plus, I use a professional lab. The colors are great and the quality is wonderful. They have a lot of products available too. In addition, the lab will tell you the "best fit size" for particular images. For example, if you want a canvas for one image, you can click "best fit" after picking "canvas" and a list of sizes comes up that would best fit that image. I also use the lab for my personal printing! I have three large canvases from my own wedding! I love them!

## What should we wear to an engagement session?

Whatever makes you feel amazing! Bright colors and accessories are fun. I love it when ladies bring additional jewelry, scarfs, and hats to mix up their outfits. I recommend staying away from patterns and stripes that are too close together. The camera doesn't like them. Also, ladies, if you wear heels, bring flip-flops to walk in, just in case. ;) How about a themed engagement session? I've photographed country & city themes, and most recently, [a 1950's engagement session](#). So fun!



## Will you pick the location for the engagement session or can we pick the location?

I love it when my couples pick the location. However, I will pick it if you are completely stumped as to where we could take the photos. Remember, it's not about the location, an engagement session is all about your love! :)

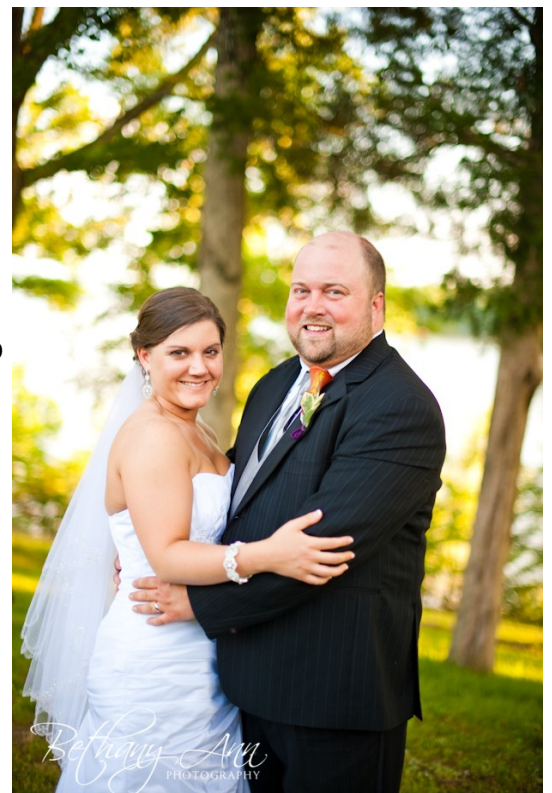


## Why is photography so expensive?

Custom, quality, artistic photography is expensive.

Value your wedding photography, and you will not be disappointed. Your wedding day is ONE day out of the 50+ years you will likely spend with your spouse. The flowers fade, the food is devoured, the dress is stored away, but the photography lasts forever. Make sure you invest in your memories properly. I have never met someone who regrets spending money on their photography. I have met many couples who regret not spending MORE on their photography. If you value your memories, keep in mind that being a photographer is *so much more* than showing up on the day of the wedding and spending 8 hours with a wonderful bride & groom.

After the wedding, the work has just started for the photographer. I am not a shoot and burn photographer. I spend time with *and* take care of your images. Besides my own 8 hours with the bride & groom, I have to factor in the second photographer's payment, the time after the wedding spent importing the images, backing up the images, editing, culling, exporting, uploading, and blogging the images. Not to mention, I need to make sure I can cover unforeseen items such as, broken equipment (I dropped a flash last summer!), back-up gear (yes, I have back-up gear!), and car issues (pot holes are not my friend!). And then there are the items I HAVE to cover: insurance, equipment maintenance, taxes, business license renewals, membership to professional photography associations, on-site and off-site back-up systems, and online websites. Oh yeah, and I need to make a little profit for items like food, electricity, chap stick and cat toys for Lexi Mae. ;)



**What if something happens to you and you can't shoot our wedding?**

Oh goodness! I don't want to think about it! But, if that ever happens, I have a network of photographers who I know would step in if need be.

**Are you insured?**

Yep! And along with a second shooter, I have back-up gear. One can never be too prepared. :)

**What is the payment plan?**

25% of the total is due to reserve the date – this is called a retainer. Two

25% payments are split up according to how far in advance you book. The other 25% is paid two weeks before your wedding day.

**How far in advance do you book weddings?**

I've booked weddings a year and a half out, to one month out! Popular dates, like 10-10-10, and summer dates usually book at least 6 months out. The safest idea is to book your photographer sooner rather than later.



**What form of payment do you take?**

Cash and checks.

**Are there discounts for your services?**

Every single wedding I spend the same amount of time and energy into making your wedding day, and your images, truly unique and remarkable. Because of this, I cannot offer discounts.

## Do you provide High Resolution files?

Yes! I include the high resolution color-corrected files in my collections and as an additional option to purchase later.

## Will the images on my CD have your logo on them?

No, I only put a logo on the images on my website and [Facebook](#), because I do not want people printing those images off of the internet. Those files are sized for the web, and low-resolution, so they will look awful, if printed.

Plus, my logo informs all your friends who took your amazing images. ;)

## How many photos will be black & white? Will we get to pick which ones are black & white?

Usually 10-15% of the images are black and white or sepia toned. I do not take requests to change images into black and white or back into color. If an image is delivered in black and white, it will stay in black and white. By hiring me, you are allowing me artistic license.
